Red Cross Responds to Dawson Fire

Dawson, IL: The Illinois Capital Area Chapter of the American Red Cross responded to a fire this evening at 11145 Greenridge in Dawson.

Casework interviewers from the Red Cross met with the two individuals affected to identify immediate needs resulting from the fire. Basic emergency assistance including food, clothing and shelter is being provided.

Every year, between the months of November and March (the months commonly referred to as “Fire Season”) the American Red Cross responds to roughly half of its responses for the entire year. Typically, these responses are to single-family fires. So far this fire season, the chapter has provided assistance for 40% more individuals than at this time last year.

“We are grateful to have community support that allows us to make a difference in the lives of those affected by disasters. It is the community who makes what we do possible,” said Jenny Antonacci, Community Relations Manager for the Illinois Capital Area Chapter. “By supporting our Local Disaster Relief Fund, people can give others the greatest gift of all...*hope.*”
