American Red Cross Responds to Springfield Apartment Fire

Springfield, IL: The American Red Cross Illinois Capital Area Chapter responded to an apartment fire last night at Near North Village, 401 E. Jefferson St. The fire displaced forty residents.

Red Cross caseworkers are meeting with the affected individuals to identify their immediate needs resulting from the fire. Emergency assistance including food, clothing, replacement medications and mental health counseling will be provided for those in need.

This is the second apartment fire the Illinois Capital Area Chapter has responded to in two weeks. On June 5 the chapter responded to a fire at Chatham Hills Apartments and provided assistance for affected individuals.

On average, the Illinois Capital Area Chapter responds to a disaster every three days. Last year alone responding to more than 115 disaster incidents, including 104 house fires, 2 incidents of flooding, 1 winter storm, 1 windstorm, 1 transportation accident, and 6 other incidents, providing emergency assistance to 534 individuals.
