RED CROSS RESPONDS TO MOBILE HOME PARK DAMAGE IN CHATHAM

Springfield, IL: The American Red Cross, Illinois Capital Area Chapter responded to straight-line wind damage caused to mobile homes in Chatham yesterday morning. Multiple mobile homes in Chatham Villa were damaged.

Casework interviewers from the Red Cross met with individuals affected to identify immediate needs resulting from the damage. Basic emergency assistance including food and shelter is being provided for nine families who were affected.

On average, the Red Cross, Illinois Capital Area Chapter responds to a disaster every three days. Last year alone responding to more than 115 disaster incidents, including 104 house fires, 2 incidents of flooding, 1 winter storm, 1 windstorm, 1 transportation accident, and 6 other incidents, providing emergency assistance to 534 individuals.

“We are grateful to have community support that allows us to make a difference in the lives of those affected by disasters. It is the community who makes what we do possible,” said Jenny Antonacci, Community Relations Manager for the Illinois Capital Area Chapter. “By supporting our Local Disaster Relief Fund, people can give others the greatest gift of all...*hope*.”
