American Red Cross Disaster Action Team Volunteers Assist Springfield Family After Fire

The American Red Cross Illinois Capital Area Chapter provided assistance to a Springfield family of four after a family severely damaged their home. It was the Chapter's fifth residential fire response in January.

The fire occurred on Saturday, January 21 at 1236 N. Oak Lane, Springfield. American Red Cross Disaster Action Team (DAT) volunteers met with the affected individuals and provided them financial assistance for shelter, clothing, and food. As of today, the Chapter has provided financial assistance to 13 individuals affected by residential fires in January.
