Red Cross Responds to Springfield Fire

The American Red Cross, Illinois Capital Area Chapter responded to a fire yesterday evening at 24 Anchor Drive in Springfield. A Disaster Action Team (DAT) was dispatched to the scene to meet with the 2 adults affected by the disaster.

Casework interviewers from the Red Cross met with the individuals affected to identify immediate needs resulting from the fire. Basic emergency assistance including food, clothing, and shelter are being provided for.

On average, the Illinois Capital Area Chapter responds to a disaster every three days; last year alone responding to more than 109 incidents, including 94 house fires, 3 tornado touchdowns, 4 incidents of gas leaks, 3 high windstorms, and two transportation accidents; providing nearly \$87,000 in emergency disaster assistance to 572 adults and children.

“We feel good knowing that we will make a difference in the lives of those affected; however, it is the community who makes what we do possible,” said Jenny Antonacci, Community Relations Coordinator for the Illinois Capital Area Chapter. “By supporting our Local Disaster Relief Fund or becoming a Red Cross volunteer, people can give others the greatest gift of all...*hope.*”
